248TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE BATTLE OF PRINCETON









January 5, 2025 was as cold as it was on January 3, 1777 when Continentals defeated Crown forces in the seminal battle at Princeton. Despite the cold, this year's *Experience the Battle of Princeton* had almost 1,700 spectators and over 350 reenactors, including cannon and horses. "A fantastic success," noted Ben Strong, PBS president.

Following the reenactment, a memorial wreathlaying ceremony, with representatives from lineage military and legacy groups, was held at the iconic Mercer Oak, with over 500 attending. We thank our sponsors, Lorna Hainesworth, Society of the Cincinnati, New Jersey, NJM Insurance Group, and the New Jersey Society Sons of the American Revolution as well as our narrator, Will Krakower, and the reenactment's director, Ken Gavin, vice president of the Princeton Battlefield Society. SENATOR ANDREW ZWICKER TO BE HONORED WITH 2025 MERCER OAK AWARD

Ben Strong, president, on behalf of the Princeton Battlefield Society's trustees, has announced that State Senator Andrew Zwicker will receive the 2025 Mercer Oak Award on June 12. "Senator Zwicker is a committed friend and advocate of the Princeton Battlefield as a primary American Revolution historic site," stated Strong. "Honoring him with this award offers us an opportunity to thank him for his leadership on behalf of the park, site of a seminal victory here in 1777."

Zwicker was the leader of legislative efforts in Trenton to secure a \$1.3 million grant to upgrade and improve the battlefield in preparation for the celebration of the Nation's 250th Anniversary. The grant will support the site's re-interpretation plans, directed by the American Battlefield Trust in partnership with the State's Department of Environment Protection and the Princeton Battlefield Society.





Zwicker represents the 16th Legislative District. He serves as chair of the Legislative Oversight Committee, vice chair of the Higher Education and Labor Committees, and sits on the Budget and Appropriations Committee. A lifelong New Jersey resident, Zwicker is head of Public Engagement & Workforce Development at Princeton University's Plasma Physics Laboratory, a world leader in developing an advanced form of energy.

A MILESTONE IN VISITOR EXPERIENCES

The most recent phase in the Princeton Battlefield's revitalization, occurred in November with the unveiling of new visitor-friendly signage to expand an understanding and appreciation of what happened here. The unveiling ceremony highlighted the American Battlefield Trust, Department of Environmental Protection, and Princeton Battlefield Society partnership to re-imagine the historic significance of the Princeton Battlefield.

A recent focus of these efforts was the unveiling of an innovative "battle window" at Moulder's battery on the battlefield. The sign applies elements from the James Peale painting on an acrylic window, allowing visitors to better visualize how battle actions unfolded on the landscape.



When completed, new battlefield signage will include ten additional signs as well as a new battlefield map funded by Americana Corner and the Society of the Cincinnati, New Jersey.

New Thomas Clarke Video

A new education video, *Thomas Clarke, An Eyewitness to the Battle of Princeton* is now available for viewing. The twelve minute video can be viewed on our website (www. pbs1777.org). The battle on the Clarke farms, its impact on a Quaker farming family, and its aftermath are related by Thomas Clarke, portrayed by actor Ian Mulreaney of Burlington, New Jersey.



The video was made possible, in part, by the Mercer County Division of Culture & Heritage with funding from the New Jersey Historical Commission and the Mercer County Board of County Commissions and by members and donors of the Princeton Battlefield Society. It continues the Princeton Battlefield Society's educational initiative, including Eyewitness of the American Revolution cards and videos, interpreting the American Revolution and Battle of Princeton on behalf of those who fought and felt its impact.

The video was written and directed by Paul Kelley. The videographer was Matt Matrale.






UPDATED BATTLE OF PRINCETON BROCHURE




